Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. I am presenting a poster presentation. Do I have to register for the meeting? Yes, <u>ALL</u> oral and poster presenters are required to register for the meeting.
- 2. I am the presenting author and have submitted my COI. Do I need to submit COIs for all the co-authors? No, only the presenting author needs to be disclosed.
- 3. I submitted an abstract and listed 10 co-authors however, I have an additional 5 I would like to add. Is that possible? No, unfortunately, once the abstract is submitted and accepted, changes are not allowed. However, if your abstract is accepted as a Podium Presentation, you will have the opportunity once your manuscript is submitted to the IFAR.
- 4. My abstract was accepted as a poster presentation. Do I need to be present? Yes, you must be present or a representative (one of the co-authors).
- 5. I will not be able to attend the conference this year and my abstract was accepted as an oral presentation. You must have a co-author or replacement to give the lecture.
- 6. The manuscript deadline is quickly approaching, and I am waiting on reviews from the corresponding author. Can I request an extension? You may request an extension; however, it is rare that an extension is granted. The deadline is well posted in advance in the abstract module, website, and several blast emails.
- 7. How do I reserve Housing? The housing link can be found on the ARS website (<u>American-rhinologic.org</u>) Rooms a quickly filling up so do not wait to make a reservation: https://book.passkey.com/e/50763947
- 8. Are there any penalties for not submitting a manuscript? YES! Each podium presentation is required to submit a single, unique corresponding manuscript. If a manuscript is not received prior to presentation, all manuscript authors are prohibited from oral abstract presentations at ARS meetings for 2 years.
- 9. Should the abstract be accepted as a poster/oral does the no industry affiliated presenter rule apply to poster/orals where there is no link to CME hours? The posters are not linked to cme. Orals are linked to cme and industry cannot present an oral presentation at the meetings.
- 10. Does the ARS Annual Meeting accept previously presented abstracts, and are there any special requirements (if they are published would they not be allowed?) The ARS will accept abstracts that have been presented at other conferences, however ONLY if they have not been published elsewhere.
- 11. Copyright do authors or the congress retain copyright? Oral presenters must submit a manuscript and copyright belongs to the presenter, but it can't be published anywhere else. IFAR has the right to refusal.
- 12. Our embargo policy: Industry Promotion of Material Presented at a Meeting. The American Rhinologic Society does not condone pre-meeting advertising of the content of oral or poster presentations from the Scientific Sessions. Simple locally done notices describing the time and location of the presentation are acceptable. Press releases sent out after the corresponding scientific session are welcome to reference that the presentation was given as part of the Scientific Session of the ARS Meeting.
