Rhinologists in Private Practice (RiPP): Leading the Way in Education and Innovation

As 2025 ends and 2026 approaches, RiPP continues to gain momentum and grow, now with over 190 members. With the launch of new Rhinocasts, innovative in-office

programming, and an increasingly prominent presence at ARS meetings, RiPP is setting the pace for practice-based education and engagement in the field of rhinology.

Fall ARS Meeting Highlights

RiPP members played a significant role at the ARS Fall Meeting in Indianapolis, shaping crucial conversations around office-based rhinology, multidisciplinary care, and practice management. Their active participation continues to amplify the voice of private practice rhinologists within the broader ARS community.

Of particular note were two panels led by RiPP leaders:

- Mary Ashmead's panel: "Advances and Obstacles in In-Office Rhinologic Procedures: Technology and Coding" explored both the promise of emerging in-office tools and the practical realities of coding and reimbursement.
- Leah Hauser's panel: "Bridging Airways: Integrating Care for Patients with Sinonasal Disease and OSA" emphasized collaborative, airway-centered care models that integrate rhinology and sleep medicine.
- Community and Networking: Networking and collegial support remain central to RiPP's mission. The recent networking event in Indianapolis, generously sponsored by AstraZeneca and Hemostasis, highlighted the importance of bringing private practice rhinologists together to share experiences, troubleshoot challenging cases, and discuss real-world business issues

in a relaxed, informal setting. Such engagement will continue to be a priority for RiPP moving forward

Upcoming Rhinocast Series

RiPP remains dedicated to providing practical, high-yield educational content with two RiPP Rhinocasts scheduled in 2026 and the second annual in-office rhinologic procedures course.

The Rhinocast series continues to be a cornerstone of RiPP's educational offerings:

- January 12th Rhinocast: Titled "CRSwNP: Where Has It Been, Where Is It Going". This session will be moderated by David Yen with featured panelists Greg Davis, Leah Hauser, and Paul Radabaugh. This educational event will be sponsored by Regeneron. This interactive session will walk through practical, case-based approaches to selecting and sequencing biologic therapies for patients with chronic rhinosinusitis with nasal polyps and related comorbid disease. It will focus on identifying appropriate candidates, comparing available biologic options, and discussing real-world strategies for assessing response and determining when to continue, switch, or discontinue treatment.
- February 25th Rhinocast: Titled "Incorporating Allergy Into Your Practice". This session will be moderated by Doug Reh with featured panelists Chris Davis, Cecilia Demask, and Chadi Makary. The event sponsor will be BioTek. This Rhinocast will delve into both operational and clinical aspects of adding allergy services to a rhinology-focused practice. It will discuss options such as hiring an allergist, developing an internal allergy program, or collaborating with third-party allergy service providers.
- Please keep an eye out for upcoming ARS communications for the scheduled times for these Rhinocast

presentations and information on how to register.

Upcoming Second Annual RiPP In-Office Based Sinus Surgery Course

On March 27-28, RiPP will host the second annual RiPP Office Based Rhinology Course at the Integra laboratory in Princeton, NJ. The event will again feature a nationally diverse group of early career private practice rhinologists and ENT surgeons seeking to expand their expertise in office-based care and practice growth. Course faculty will deliver a focused curriculum tailored to the evolving needs of today's rhinology private practices. Over two days, attendees will engage in lectures and panels on office-based rhinology procedures, best practices in billing and coding, strategies for effective marketing, and methods for building and scaling a successful private practice. Hands-on dissection labs offered on both days will allow participants to practice advanced office-based techniques in a collegial, mentored environment. RiPP looks forward to providing another highly interactive, high-yield learning experience and to welcoming rhinologists from across the country to Princeton in March.

RiPP at the 2026 SSS course

Looking ahead to the 2026 SSS course in Miami, RiPP will host a half-day breakout session which will focus on private practice rhinology and the business of medicine. While specific topics are yet to be announced, they are expected to address high-impact areas such as coding, staffing, ancillary services, and strategic practice growth. Readers are encouraged to look out for future updates as the agenda is finalized and to plan to attend if they are interested in strengthening the practice-management side of their rhinology careers.

Sybill Storz (1937–2025): A Legacy of Innovation and Compassion

The global medical community loses a pioneer with the passing of Sybill Storz, who died peacefully on November 28, 2025, at the age of 88, surrounded by her family. As the long-standing leader of Karl Storz, Sybill transformed a family firm into an international vanguard of endoscopic technology.

Joining her father, Karl Storz, in the late 1950s, she assumed leadership in 1996 and helped mold the company into a worldwide leader in endoscopic, imaging, and surgical technology. Her tenure was marked by a rare combination of meticulous technical detail and a bold international strategy. Beyond the boardroom, she was a dedicated philanthropist, most recently serving as Chair of the Karl Storz Foundation which she founded. She and her company have been longstanding industry supporters of the ARS, and this partnership along with the technological advances she oversaw at the Karl Storz company contributed to where we are today in the field of rhinology. The ARS would like to recognize Sybill Storz as the innovator and leader that she was and to extend our heartfelt condolences to her family, friends, and associates.
